




Select Occupations by Race and Ethnicity in Washington State, 2022

















Home Health Aides and Nursing Assistants Receiving Public Assistance in Washington State, 2021






Housing Cost-Burdened

Defined as housing costs—including rent, mortgage payments, and/or utility bills—that exceed 30 percent of a household's total income.


