Develop <u>dentists</u> who will make a personal commitment to <u>serving</u> the needs of <u>rural</u> and <u>underserved</u>






NATIONAL RURAL DENTAL SHORTAGE

- Without targeted programs, less than 1 of every 20 graduating dentists choose to practice in rural areas.
- Just as WWAMI addresses the shortage of primary care doctors, RIDE has a similar intention for dentists.

YEAR 1: EASTERN WASHINGTON UNIVERSITY

RIDE dental student's **basic** sciences training in EWU & WWAMI infrastructure.



YEAR 3: UNIVERSITY OF WASHINGTON

Clerkship and dental comprehensive care clinical training in Seattle.



YEAR 2: RUOP ROTATION


Four-week **clinical rotation** in rural WA communities.



YEAR 4: EXTENDED ROTATION

Five-month clinical rotation in rural WA communities.

Most patients < 200% federal poverty level



YEAR 2: EASTERN WASHINGTON UNIVERSITY

Didactic and pre-clinical simulation **courses** in Spokane.







WA DENTAL WORKFORCE

- Higher education STEM training for rural Washingtonians
- Focused investment in expanded dental workforce in rural and underserved areas in Washington.
- Increased WA dental care capacity through student rotations in community health centers, tribal health, and IHS sites
 - To date, RIDE students have provided over 74,000 hours of patient care in rural/underserved areas



RIDE DENTAL CARE

RIDE Program Clinical Production

RIDE Student 4th Year Rotations (2019 – 2023):

• Avg. Dental Procedures: 3,461 (annually)

Avg. Dental Patients Treated: 4,744 (annually)

• Total hours of dental care: 5,760 (annually)





RIDE EDUCATIONAL OUTCOMES

 80% of practicing dental RIDE graduates are in rural/underserved areas.

N = 96 (2012-2024, 13 cohorts)

- Educational equivalence of RIDE track affirmed in accreditation site visits in 2012, 2016, & 2024
- The RIDE program has more applicants than we can accept.
 - Of the 314 DDS applicants chosen for interviews, 80 completed a secondary application for the RIDE program (2023, 8 slots)









RIDE Alumni Facts:

- 48% of RIDE alumni currently practice in Eastern Washington
- 70% of RIDE alumni that have completed specialty training have returned to a rural/ underserved setting since graduation
- 11% of RIDE alumni have worked as dental faculty preceptors for RIDE students since graduation

RIDE EXPANSION

- 1. Unify RIDE facilities currently located in 3 separate university's buildings:
 - WSU Riverpoint Health Sci. Building (RIDE Lab & Admin)
 - EWU Catalyst Building (RIDE Distance Learning Classroom)
 - GU/UW Health Sciences (Anatomy Lab)







RIDE EXPANSION



- Doubling RIDE enrollment from
 32 to 64 students beginning 2025
- 4. Deliver 2nd year DDS pre-clinical curriculum at EWU Spokane RIDE
 - *10 of 15 DDS quarters outside of Seattle




Additional RIDE EXPANSION FUNDING


- 12/2022 UW secured \$1.5M in federal funds for Spokane dental simulation lab for RIDE & EWU dental hygiene
- 10/2023 UW secured an additional \$1.0M from the USDA to expand RIDE's chair-side teledentistry equipment network from 35 to 47 FQHC, tribal, and IHS clinics.
- The 2023 USDA grant includes \$102,000 for AV equipment for the Spokane Regional Training Center and \$215,000 for the RIDE Seattle HS Classrooms (distance learning hub).




New RIDE Space in Spokane

RIDE RURAL HEALTH RESEARCH

- RIDE as a Rural Health Research Center
 - 5 current federal (USDA, HRSA) and DSHS oral health training grants (\$5.96 million 2022-2027)
- Provide national methodology and statewide training for oral health providers, focusing on:
 - infants/young children
 - distance learning, teledentistry
 - patients with developmental and acquired disabilities
- Supports WA oral health workforce development, including dental assistants and dental hygienists
