- IPEDS is maintained by US Department of Education's National Center for Education Statistics
 - Many staff were laid off in March, unclear how data systems will be maintained going forward
 - When agenda for this meeting was planned, annual data release had not occurred... this week 2023-2024 completions data became available

Health program completions data

- Knowing your priorities for workforce data is helpful; staff can provide a more in-depth look at a few professions
 - Employers report the following occupations as most commonly experiencing exceptionally long vacancies
 - Mental health counselors, social workers (MSW), substance use disorder professionals
 - Physicians, nurse practitioners, medical assistants
 - Registered nurses, licensed practical nurses
 - Dental hygienists, dental assistants
