


# Washington's Current Labor Market






# Washington's Total Covered Employment




Employment growth total covered and health care and social assistance, Washington state, 2001-2024




Health care and social assistance by ownership, Washington state, 2001-2024

Health care and social assistance by County, Washington state, 2024








# Healthcare Industry in Washington State: Conclusion

- Healthcare employment in Washington grew more than twice as fast as total employment, signaling sustained expansion
- Investments in primary care, behavioral health, and telemedicine laid the foundation for broader service delivery
- High hiring and separation rates reflect both intense demand and systemic stress, but also opportunity for innovation and reform

- The sector remains resilient despite a cooling job market, driven by aging populations and rising chronic disease prevalence
- Behavioral health needs are surging, outpacing workforce capacity and straining existing systems
- Post-pandemic burnout and staffing shortages are impacting retention and recruitment across clinical roles

# Healthcare Industry in Washington State: Outlook

- Healthcare and social assistance are projected to be the leading drivers employment growth from 2023 to 2033
- Washington will require thousands of new professionals: especially in allied health and behavioral health to meet both current and unmet demand
- Technology, including telehealth and Al-driven diagnostics, will be essential to expanding access and improving efficiency
- Strategic workforce planning and cross-sector collaboration are critical to sustaining momentum and ensuring equitable care.
